Meal arrangements

- ✓ All breakfast and evening meals are included at the hostel.
- ✓ We will need to buy **1 breakfast** at Gatwick Airport on the 3rd of February (can be a packed breakfast), **4 lunches** and possibly **1 evening meal** at Lyon Airport on the 7th of February.

Travel tips – money

The currency in Lyon is the Euro.

We recommend that students take **100€** with them in cash (50€ for 4 lunches and 50€ for souvenirs).

Travel tips – packing

Mainly winter weather with an average temperature of **4°C**.

We will be walking quite a lot.

As such, we recommend that students wear comfortable and sensible clothes

- ✓ Trainers/boots (in case of snow)
- ✓ Jeans/leggings/sports clothes
- ✓ Jumpers/jackets/warm waterproof coat. (Especially needed on the 3rd at 04:00h am!)
- ✓ Pen and a notepad to write down new things you learn!
- ✓ **UK-Europe adaptor**

Tour basics

Luggage allowance

Each person on the flight will be entitled to:

- Hand Luggage: **One piece of standard baggage** no bigger than 56 cm x 45 cm x 25 cm including the handle, pockets and wheels.
- Checked in Luggage: **One piece not exceeding 15 kg** and no bigger than 90 cm x 75 cm x 43 cm including the handle, pockets and wheels

We recommend taking:

- ✓ 1 piece of checked in luggage (**15kg**)
- ✓ One rucksack (for everyday use)

Remember that if you carry any liquids or gels with you, they must not be bigger than 100ml and must be placed into a one clear plastic zip-top bag.

Only one carrier bag is permitted per passenger.

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Day 1 - Monday: French learning.

Visit of the Collège Val Gelon de La Rochette in the morning.

Eating by the Lac Du Bourget for lunch.

Shopping at the shopping centre in the afternoon.

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Day 4 - Thursday: History

Discovering Lyon with a photo competition – l'Opéra, la place des Terreaux, l'Hotel de Ville, la Rue de la République, la Place de la République.

Lunch on Bellecour.

Guided visit of the *Centre d'histoire de la résistance et de la deportation* in the afternoon.

Evening meal at Flam's restaurant

Day 5 - Friday: Lyon

11:00h – Mass at the Fourvière cathedral

Guided visit of Le Vieux Lyon (old town of Lyon)

19:20h – Flight back

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Expectations

SAFETY

- Students will be given an emergency card which will include contact details for staff
- Follow instructions first time and listen carefully
- On the coach - always sitting down in seats with seatbelts on
- On the airplane – follow the cabin crew’s instructions
- When crossing roads it is important to be vigilant and careful (remember to look on the right side of the road)
- Be respectful to locals and not draw adverse attention
- In the event of an incident, pupils and staff to follow guidance of security personnel at any venue and all emergency services



Expectations

- When abroad, our students are ambassadors of our school and their home country. Students should bear this in mind at all times and behave sensibly and responsibly at all times (don't take unnecessary risks).
- Follow any instructions from your teachers, including the ones from the Language School and the French school. Keep our good reputation!
- Be punctual when you are required to meet the group and teachers at a certain place (i.e. after having some free time, waking up in the mornings...etc.)
- When you pack your clothes, take into account that we will be attending a mass on Friday, where there is a strict dress code. Shoulders and thighs need to be covered.



Expectations

- Respect and be considerate of other people in the hotel (i.e. no noise after 10pm at nights).
- Students must not leave the accommodation without a teacher.
- Be aware of possible pickpocketing. iPads, cameras and all valuable equipment are brought at **student's own risk**. They are responsible for looking after it.
- During free time, remain in groups of **at least 4**
- Mobile phones will be allowed for use during students' own **free time** (on the coach/in rooms/sightseeing) – but not during activities, visits or mealtimes.
