

Dear Parents and Carers,

You will have heard that the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have directed that, following official advice and in order to keep each other safe, save lives and support the NHS, from tomorrow evening we will no longer be able to gather for public acts of worship. This includes the Celebration of Mass which will be celebrated in private by clergy. Churches will remain open for private prayer where people can gather individually, following the rules for social distancing.

We are living in difficult and worrying times. Not being able to go to Mass is a cause of deep sadness for us all but we can and should join in spiritually by watching the live-streaming of the Mass and joining in with its prayers from our homes. In doing so we are making an act of spiritual communion; this is our way to share in the Sacrifice of the Mass in these days.

As long as these emergency circumstances last, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed.
