Dear Parents/Carers

I know you will be aware of the latest government guidance and rules as a result of London being placed in Tier 2. We continue to follow the guidance in school and are working hard to ensure the whole community remains safe. The girls are doing their best to keep themselves and their peers safe in school.



I have had further reports of girls removing their masks on public transport and ask that you remind your daughters to keep their masks on whilst travelling to and from school . The number of cases is rising so we all need to do what we can to keep the community safe.

Can I also ask that you ensure your daughter has a mask for use in school each day . A number of girls are coming to school without a mask and we do not have a limitless supply, all girls should have their own masks.

PE KIT

During the pandemic girls are allowed to come to school on the days that they have PE lessons in their PE kit. Can I remind you that the PE kit must be worn properly following the uniform guidelines that are on the website. The weather is turning much colder and wetter and therefore the girls need to be wearing the winter kit which comprise of a St Ursula's tracksuit, (NOT leggings), polo shirt and trainers.












Black History Book Highlight
