Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know schools are opening fully from Monday 8th March.

Our students will be returning on a staggered basis over the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week with the intention that all students will be in school for face to face teaching from Thursday 11th March.



The government have stipulated that students are tested on return and then twice more. After that the expectation is that students are to be tested at home twice weekly. More details of the staggered return and the testing will be sent to you next week.

We have also received some guidance from Ofqual as to how GCSE grades will be calculated and awarded to Year 11 students. We are looking at that guidance in detail and more information on that will be sent to all Year 11 students and their parents next week.

We are very much looking forward to welcoming all the students back the week after next and hope that everyone takes the opportunity to get their uniform and equipment ready for their return.

School uniform rules apply as they always have and we expect that everyone returns in the correct uniform ready for their face to face learning.

The weather has taken a turn for the better and I hope you all manage to take advantage of the sunshine. I hope you all have a relaxing weekend.

DISCERNING & JOYFUL – even in difficult times





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Idiom of the week

Do you know what 'a little bird told me' means?

Unusually for idioms, the Spanish equivalent of 'a little bird told me' is literal: Me ha dicho un pajarito que ...
