On the last day of the Spring Term (Friday 1st April) we had the incredible privilege of Margaret Mizen coming to speak to our Y11s about the life of her son Jimmy who was killed in Lee, South East London on 10th May 2008. He was a pupil at St Thomas More in Eltham and very much a part of our wider Catholic Community - some teachers who currently work at St Ursula's used to teach Jimmy.

Jimmy was 16 when he died, about to start his GCSEs, and Margaret spoke beautifully and eloquently to our Y11s about this. We had some fantastic questions, time for collection, and also a poignant collective worship around the themes of love and forgiveness created by our fantastic Junior Leadership Team.

We are so grateful for Margaret's time and to see how faith can be acted out every day in line with our values of Serviam. We could not have had a better speaker to give our Y11s some perspective and spiritual guidance as we enter the last stage of their education. We are eternally grateful for Margaret's contribution and cannot wait for her next visit.




The most popular books were....


On World Book Day students who wore costumes raised...
