Message from an Ursuline Sister

Dear Parents/Carers

My name is Sister Alice, and I am an Ursuline sister and have been based in Warsaw in Poland in an Ursuline convent.

I am very familiar with St. Ursula's school and with Ursuline's education. As a school with an Ursuline tradition, your daughters will become familiar with two saints: St. Ursula, the patron of the school and of Ursuline sisters worldwide, and St. Angela, who began the Ursulines in northern Italy in 1535.

Although St. Angela did not found any schools, her writings and ideas formed the bedrock of an educational tradition that now operates in schools all over the world. So, you now belong to something truly international.

St. Angela wrote about the need to love and support each other, to treat each other with respect and for those in charge of younger sisters, to encourage them, support them, and try to understand them. These ideas we have successfully taken into our education of young people in Ursuline schools.

St Ursula probably lived in the fourth century and died for her faith. Jesus was at the centre of her life. She became an inspiration for St. Angela for whom Jesus was also the centre of her life.

Your new school badge, the Serviam badge, has a simple Christian cross in the centre, to remind us that Jesus should also be at the centre of our lives and our school. That badge is worn by students all over the world.

So, your school motto is now '**Serviam**' or '**I will serve**' and you will learn more about this in your journey through school.

St. Angela often used the Italian word 'Insieme' which means 'together'. Her point was that in supporting each other we will not only find ourselves, but the God who created us and loves us. It's a beautiful idea.

My prayer for you is *that God will bless your journey through St. Ursula's; that your teachers will inspire you and that you will make good friends. Friends are a very special gift from God. May you also be happy and fulfilled.*

Uniform

Our uniform is an integral part of the day-to-day culture of school, therefore we expect it to be worn by all students. The uniform is the public face of the school. It acts as both a unifying element and a point of recognition, whilst removing from parents the financial burden of providing non-uniform clothes.

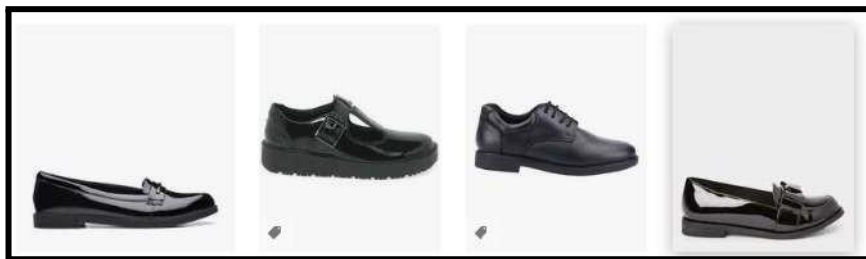


- **School blazer.** This should have the embossed school logo on it and worn with pride. The blazer must be worn at all times, unless the Headteacher permits otherwise e.g. during hot weather.
- **Pleated School skirt/school trousers.** The skirt is a distinctive school style, and NO OTHER VARIANT IS ACCEPTABLE DURING THE FIVE YEARS THE STUDENTS ARE IN THE SCHOOL. The skirt should be below the knee and above the ankle.
- Plain navy St Ursula's uniform tailored trousers. No other variant is acceptable during the five years the students are in the school. No jeans, skinny fit trousers or leggings are permitted.
- **Red plain V-necked jumper** with designated coloured stripe from September 2023 – this should be worn every day

YR11 – Lilac / YR10 – Gold / YR9 – Green / YR8 – Blue / YR7 Red

- **Blouse.** White reversed collar blouse. Jumpers and T-shirts should not be worn under the blouse. The school blouse must be tucked into the skirt, and it is not to be regarded as an overblouse.
- **Tights or knee high socks navy blue or black.** Socks must be worn to the knee.
- **Shoes should support the whole foot.** Shoes, which do not firmly grip the upper part of the foot, are not suitable. Boots or ankle boots must not be worn (this includes Kicker Boots). The heels should be flat, no higher than 3cm. The colour is plain black. Bows etc. are not allowed and toes should not be too pointed. Black trainers, Sling back shoes, ankle strap shoes, fabric or plastic beach-type i.e flip-flops and sliders are not suitable.

Fashion Trends must not be followed.



- **Outdoor Uniform.** The school blazer over which a plain navy/black coat should be worn in cold or wet weather. Denim/leather jackets, track suit tops, fleeces/hoodies, body warmers/gilets are not allowed.
- **Winter scarves and gloves.** Plain black or navy blue without any logos.
- **School bag.** Black or navy, strong and made of sturdy material. The bag must be free standing, closed at the top and capable of holding books 40cm x 30cm. Shaped rucksacks in black or navy are acceptable but **should not carry** the maker's branding logo i.e *Nike tick as one example*. Handbags are not acceptable school bags.
- **Hats** are not permitted in school unless advised by the Headteacher with regard to adverse weather or school trips.

PE

- **Games kit.** (purchased at suppliers)
- St Ursula's Joggers,
- St Ursula's PE Jumper,
- St Ursula's Polo Shirt,
- St Ursula's socks, navy blue that cover the ankle. A pair of predominantly white, navy or black sports trainers (***Leisure shoes, canvas shoes and plimsolls are not allowed***).
- **PE. Dance and Trampolining.** St Ursula's PE leggings





All students are expected to wear the correct uniform and to wear it well. The school uniform is kept as simple and inexpensive as possible. If there are any special temporary difficulties, please let the Pastoral Lead know. **All items of the uniform should be clearly marked with the owner's name.**

Students may wear a watch, a small crucifix under the blouse and one small set of plain gold or silver studs in the lower ear lobe; Nose studs or any other form of body piercings are forbidden. Retainers for piercings are not permitted. No other jewellery is allowed.

All make-up, including make-up accessories, are banned. Nail varnish and false/acrylic nails are banned. Nail extensions represent a Health & Safety risk in a number of practical lessons and for this reason are not allowed.

False eyelashes/eyelash extensions are not permitted.

Hairbands/headbands/hair clips must be navy blue or black. Hair embellishments and beads are not permitted.

Hairstyles, hair colour and hair colour including braids should be a natural hair colouring; extreme hair colouring, e.g. Fire engine red, Pink, Blue etc. is not allowed: Dip dying and half hair dying is not permitted. Hair should not be worn over the face or eyes. Undercuts are not permitted. The definition of extreme lies with the school; failure to comply with the aforesaid may result in the immediate sending home of the student.

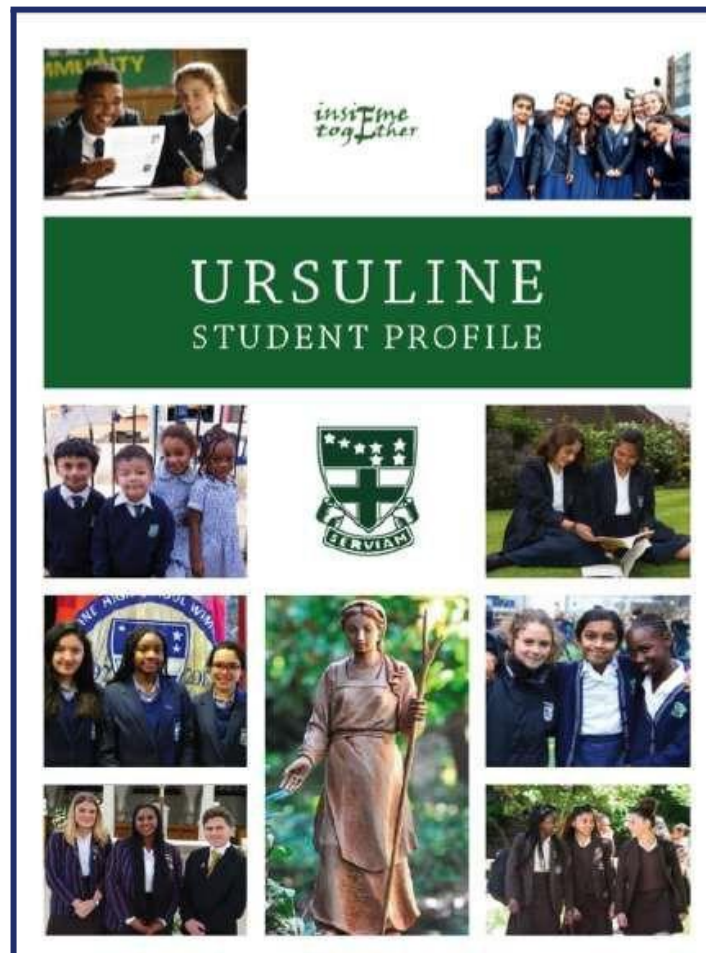

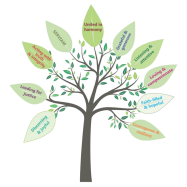
Serviam & the UEC

Spiritual Life of St Ursula's

Sacrament of Reconciliation

During Advent and Lent all students and staff are given the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Weekly Mass

Mass takes place every Friday morning at 8.00 am, at Our Ladye Star of the Sea. This Mass is an opportunity to pray for any members of our school community. Key Stage 3 students also attend the Parish Mass on a rota basis taking a full and active part in the service.

Prayer

Prayer underpins everything we do, but there are many ways to pray and no one way is better than another. At St. Ursula's you will find many opportunities to pray in year group or form group collective worship, small group prayer, or private prayer.





Retreats

All year groups have a retreat day. Some are in school, facilitated by outside providers, whilst others are off-site. Opportunities for day and residential retreats are very important for our students to experience various styles of prayer that are relevant and attractive for their age group. This experience enables them to develop their own spirituality and unique way of relating to God.

Outreach

There is an active Chaplaincy Team which supports the spiritual and liturgical life of the school as well as putting faith into action through charitable outreach in the spirit of SERVIAM.

Life at St Ursula's

Secondary school life is a little different to that at primary school. You now have a range of subjects to explore throughout each day and you will need to move from one classroom to the next. In order to know which class to go to, you will be given a timetable like the one below. The school day is divided into five lessons known as periods (P1 etc). The School Gate is opened at 8:20 a.m. and Students are expected to be on site by 8:30am for line up.

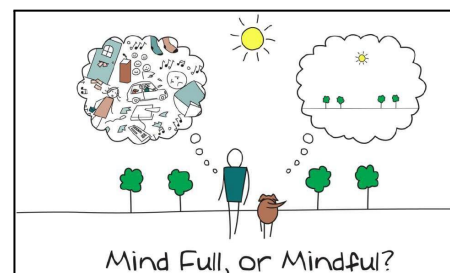
